

# MNTC AUTOMOTIVE SERVICE TECHNOLOGY SCHOLARSHIPS

Each school year, Automotive Service Technology (AST) students who meet the requirements will be eligible to apply for three scholarships. These scholarships can be applied toward tuition, books or industry tools. Students may qualify to receive only one of these scholarships per year.

Applicants should be currently enrolled, and continuing in any AST course major(s). Applicants are judged on multiple factors, including performance in their automotive technology courses, overall academic performance, instructor(s) evaluation, GPA, mentor evaluation and participation in other activities, such as SkillsUSA. Applicant's attendance must be within the guidelines of MNTC attendance policy. Deserving students must possess "the right attitude and have a good work ethic", distinguishing themselves in the Auto Service program.

### Scholarship Instructions:

- The application should be completed with all lines checked.
- The essay section should answer all five (5) questions. Each question should have its own paragraph, separated by an extra line.
- Before turning in the application packet make sure you have included: the application, one page summary essay, and a one page resume.

### Interview Prep:

Review the following tips and information regarding the interview.

1. Appearance, Composure, and Nonverbal Communication
  - a. Handshake/Greeting/Closing
  - b. Grooming/Neatness
  - c. Attire
  - d. Eye Contact/Posture
2. Preparation
  - a. Students should prepare one to two questions to ask during the interview.
    - Example: When will I know if I have been chosen to receive a scholarship?
  - b. The questions should be related to the scholarship and/or interview process (Knowledgeable questions)
    - Example: How might I improve my interview skills?
3. Verbal Communication
  - a. Delivery /Animation
  - b. Absence of Verbalized Pauses
  - c. Grammar and Vocabulary
  - d. Presentation of Ideas
  - e. Conciseness/Brevity
4. Direction
  - a. Well-Defined Goals
  - b. Confidence
  - c. Realistic/Practical
5. Personality
  - a. Enthusiastic
  - b. Motivated
  - c. Sincere
6. Qualifications
  - a. Academic Preparation
  - b. Work Experience
  - c. Leadership Experience

**Interview Questions:** This is a list of questions that the interviewers *may* ask. However, be prepared to answer questions not listed as well.

- Tell us about yourself
- Why did you choose this field?
- Why should we choose you for this scholarship?
- What are your goals? Short and long-term.
- If we speak with your instructors, what would they likely say about you?
- Why did you choose to apply for this scholarship?
- If you were to start over, what would you change about your education?
- Are you interested in pursuing a more advanced level of education?
- How can you make a difference in the automotive industry?
